- 1. Arkansas Dept. of Aeronautics Grant Update Bob Chatman Some corrections and repairs were made. Invoices have been received.
- 2. Flight School Presentation- Ed Ingold The time frame for the Flight School has been pushed back until May.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Survival Flight presentation- Lisa Bomar discussed services that are provided, and made recommendations for obtaining a membership.
- 2. Hangars- Discussion for proposals for hangar purchase The Cogswel I Hangar is up for sale. The Commission has been pursuing funding for providing a large hangar suitable for attracting one or more aviation related businesses to the airport that would increase revenues for Airport Operations.
